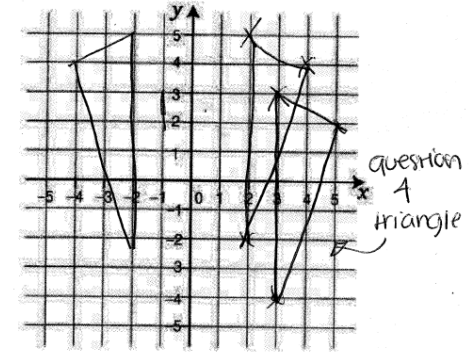

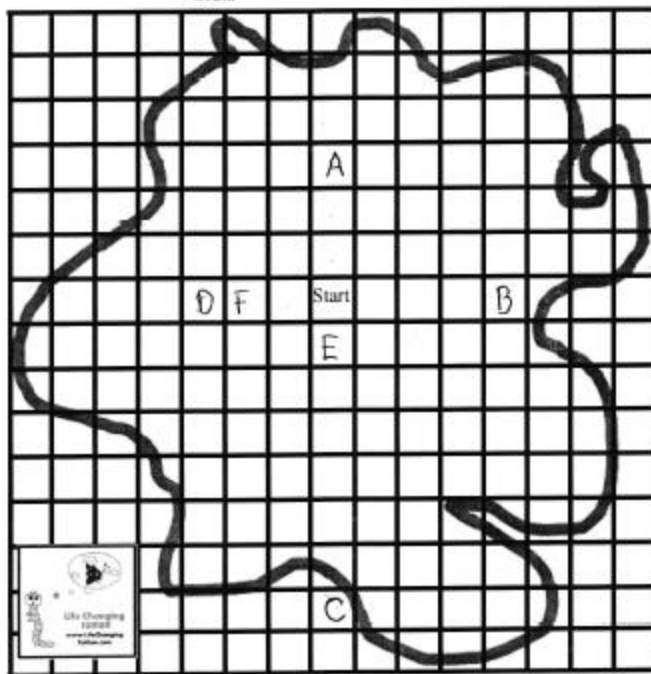

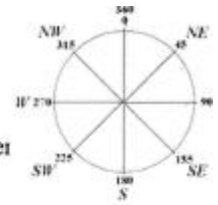

Degrees of a circle

- (1) You are facing north. You turn 180 degrees anti-clockwise. S
- (2) You are facing west. You turn 360 degrees clockwise. W
- (3) You are facing South-West. You turn 90 degrees clockwise. NW
- (4) You are facing South East. You make a quarter turn clockwise. SW
- (5) You are facing north east. You make a three quarter turn anti-clockwise. SE
