(The language of the Aztecs, called Nahuatl, is still spoken today.) It feeds on small creatures and carrion. The coyote was <u>sacred</u> to the American native peoples. They used to <u>call</u> him "the trickster".</p> <p>But for white people, the coyote became a <u>symbol</u> of a menace.</p> <p>The German artist Joseph Benys, wanted to study the <u>coyote</u>. He wanted to isolate himself with a coyote, to <u>concentrate</u> fully on the coyote. He wanted to see nothing else of America – just the coyote, <u>pure</u> and simple! So, he did an <u>extraordinary</u> thing. On arriving in Kennedy <u>airport</u>, New York, Benys was wrapped in felt, laid out on a <u>stretcher</u> and whisked in an ambulance to a <u>gallery</u> where a coyote was <u>waiting</u> for him. There was a room in the gallery, divided by a wire grille. He <u>tried</u> to talk to the coyote. After three days they got <u>used</u> to each other's company. Job done, Benys was <u>once</u> more <u>wrapped</u> in felt, laid on a stretcher and taken to JFK Airport in an <u>ambulance</u>. He had seen nothing at all of New York – <u>nothing</u> but the coyote!</p>

## NVR Cubes

1. **A** – The arrow is pointing towards the circle.
  2. **B** – The base of the heart is pointing towards the black dots.
  3. **C** – The base of the triangle is next to the 'L' shape.
  4. **A** – The side of the hexagon is facing the spots.
  5. **C** – The top of the face is nearest the circles.
  6. **D** – The sharpest corner of the diamond is facing the side of the arrow.
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1. **A** – The arrow is pointing towards the triangle.
  2. **C** – The grey square has the zigzag line along one side and the circle along the next side.
  3. **C** – The arrow shape is pointing away from the black square.
  4. **B** – The circle is next to the long side of the rectangle, not the short side.
  5. **E** – The arrow head is pointing away from the white square. The wide end of the trapezium is closest to the square.
  6. **D** – The arrow is curving up towards the base of the triangle. The circular face of the cylinder is pointing towards the side of the triangle. (A cylinder is a 3-D tube, with parallel sides and circular ends.)
