

How to do Shuffled Sentences (5 Steps)



- 1) Work out the **SUBJECT** of the Sentence (this is the person, place, idea or thing that is doing or being something in the sentence).
- 2) Work out the SUBJECT's matching **verb** (the 'doing or being' word). Pair off any adjectives with nouns and adverbs with verbs.
- 3) You should now have a group of words which form the '**base of the sentence**'. Start adding the rest of the words – underline or add numbers on the top of word bank once they have been used. (Numbering helps you remember the order of your sentence).
- 4) Other tips: From the word bank, watch out for **odd words** (eg 2 verbs in different tenses) or **conflicting words** (eg night and day) – one of these could be the odd one out.
- 5) Finally once you have formed the sentence, **re-read the sentence** to make sure it makes sense and that there are no grammar mistakes
